

Prep Uniform (Reception to Year 6)

A school uniform is part of the DNA of any school, bringing the community together, creating equality and reminding students that they are part of a working environment. We appreciate the support of our parents to meet our dress code standards ensuring that all of our girls are in the correct attire both in school and on the way to and from school.

Naming Uniform

All items of uniform must be clearly marked with the owner's surname and first name or initial.

In addition, the owner's name should be on the following garments:

Overall	below left shoulder
Games skort	left bottom hem, clearly visible
Games top	below right shoulder

All students must have a regulation games kit, which should also be clearly labelled with the full name.

Our School Uniform Shop

We are fortunate to have a School Uniform Shop on site at the Senior School in the basement of the Temple Building. Due to social distancing requirements the school shop will operate by appointment only for the foreseeable future.

Prep Uniform List

All items of uniform must be clearly marked with the owner's surname and first name or initial.

Compulsory items

- Brighton Girls blazer with school crest
- Brighton Girls tartan tunic (Reception-Year 2)
- Brighton Girls tartan kilt (Years 3-6) NB black school trousers are also available from the uniform shop for Years 5 and 6
- Brighton Girls trousers (Years 5 to 6 as alternative to kilt)
- Blouse, white, short or long-sleeved embroidered with school crest (Reception - Year 6)
- Brighton Girls V-neck pullover or cardigan, bottle green with silver grey trim (Reception - Year 6)
- Socks - plain bottle green in winter or plain green tights must be worn
- Science/Art Overall, green with navy cuffs and collar (Reception - Year 1)
- Science/Art Overall green wrap-over (Year 2 - Year 6)

Winter attire

- Coat, bottle green 'three in one' fleece and waterproof (compulsory)
- Scarf, hat and gloves, grey fleece only

Summer attire (and September up until half term)

- Summer dress, tartan (Nursery-Year 4 compulsory, Years 5 and 6 have the option of either the summer dress or the short sleeve blouse worn with the Brighton Girls tartan kilt)
- Brighton Girls cardigan (As above, to be worn with the summer dress)
- Summer headwear, green legionnaire hat
- Socks - plain white in summer (no lace or frills)

Footwear

Plain style black, with laces or strap over the instep, covering toe and heel. High or raised heels, pumps with ankle straps and patent/slip-on/ankle boots are not suitable. No trainer style or canvas shoes, no ballet-style pumps, no heels. No Dr Martin shoes with yellow stitching (other plain sensible DM styles are permissible).

School bag

- Brighton Girls Prep small backpack (Reception to Year 2)
- Brighton Girls Prep large backpack (Years 3 to 6)

Other items

Pencil cases are available from the Uniform Shop.

Sports/PE Kit

Currently all girls are expected to have a clearly named black linen bag (from the school shop).

The Sports kit should be clearly labelled and must consist of:

- Brighton Girls green games skort with crest
- Brighton Girls PE green/white top
- Shorts, green (Years 3-6 compulsory)
- Brighton Girls Prep track top (Years 3 to 6 only)
- Brighton Girls sports fleece (Reception-Year 6)
- Brighton Girls ¼ zip waterproof top - please buy the waterproof top in a size that will allow the sports fleece to fit underneath if very cold.
- Brighton Girls Prep sweatpants (Reception to Year 2) OR
- Brighton Girls Prep track bottoms (Years 3 to 6) Brighton Girls trousers (Years 3-6).
- House T-shirt (to be purchased once pupil has been assigned her 'House')
- Brighton Girls Hockey socks, knee-length, bottle green (Years 2-6)
- Plain white ankle sports socks (Years 2-6)

Swimming Kit (Optional for Year 2, compulsory for swim squad)

Brighton Girls green swimsuit

Swim hat, with logo

Swim bag

Footwear

Trainers (no fashion trainers)

Safety Equipment

Gum shield (Years 2-6) - we recommend SISU, available in the school shop

Hockey Shin pads (Years 2-6) - we recommend Kookaburra, available in the school shop

Optional Clothing (Years 3-6)

Brighton Girls baselayer top (Optional for Years 3 to 6)

Brighton Girls baselayer leggings (Optional for Years 3 to 6)

Hair

Hair should be kept off the face, in a sensible style, and if shoulder length, must be tied back. Hair ribbons and bands, if worn, must be bottle green and can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. All hair accessories must be of simple style. Small green slides may be worn.

Jewellery

No jewellery, other than a named wristwatch, may be worn in school. At her parents' request, a pupil with pierced ears may wear plain gold studs (one only in each ear), provided that permission has been obtained in writing. Otherwise no earrings may be worn.

A girl with pierced ears must remove earrings for PE. It is therefore important only to have ears pierced at the start of the summer holiday to allow time for the wound to heal so that studs etc. can be removed safely at school.

Girls may wear a religious symbol on a necklace if written permission has been received by the school at the start of each academic year.

Money

Any money required at School must be brought in a sealed envelope, labelled with name and given to the Form Teacher.

Valuables/Mobile Phones

Girls are asked not to bring valuable property or toys to School, as no responsibility can be accepted for anything damaged, lost or mislaid.
