

Senior Uniform (Years 7-11)

A school uniform is part of the DNA of any school, bringing the community together, creating equality and reminding students that they are part of a working environment. We appreciate the support of our parents to meet our dress code standards ensuring that all of our girls are in the correct attire both in school and on the way to and from school.

General Dress Code

Skirts must be knee-length. Hair should be neat in style and not dyed. Tights should not have rips, holes or ladders.

Marking of Uniform

All items of uniform must be clearly marked with the owner's surname and first name or initial.

All students must have a regulation games kit, which should also be clearly labelled with the full name.

In addition, the owner's name should be marked in the appropriate year colour*, on the following garments:

Overall	-	below left shoulder
Games skirt	-	left bottom hem, clearly visible
Games top	-	below right shoulder

Other pieces of kit to be named - fountain pens, calculators, etc. must be clearly and permanently marked.

Senior Uniform List



Compulsory items

Brighton Girls blazer with school crest

Brighton Girls knee-length tartan kilt *or*

Brighton Girls black trousers with school crest

Blouse, white, short or long-sleeved embroidered with school crest

Brighton Girls v-neck pullover, green

Plain black socks (no trainer socks) or tights must be worn. Tights should not have rips, holes or ladders.

Overall, green cotton or polycotton for Art and Science. Year 10 and above may wear a plain white overall if they prefer. An overall is compulsory for all science lessons.

Footwear

Shoes, plain style black flat leather. No trainer style (such as Nike or Converse) or canvas shoes, no ballet-style pumps, no heels more than one inch, no stilettos. No Dr Marten shoes with yellow stitching (other plain sensible DM styles are permissible).

School bag

Preferably a backpack which should be strong, waterproof with secure fastenings (non-regulation). Please note handbags or tote bags are not allowed.

Winter attire

Plain dark coat (non-regulation/optional - please note no denim, leather, fur, etc. and other colours are not acceptable)

Scarf, green/grey college wrap (from school shop)

Hat, plain dark green or black (non-regulation/optional)

Gloves, plain black (non-regulation/optional)

Please note coats, scarves, hats and gloves should not be worn once in school.

Sports Kit

A Brighton Girls sports bag which needs to contain the following clearly labelled sports kit -

Brighton Girls black skirt with crest

Brighton Girls green sports top with crest

Brighton Girls black waterproof jacket (top layer new for 2021)

Brighton Girls branded baselayers - tops & bottoms (optional)

Brighton Girls tracksuit – black track suit bottoms and green/grey fleece top

Brighton Girls running leggings (optional)

Brighton Girls Hockey socks, knee-length, bottle green

Plain white ankle sports socks

Dance

Dance Leotard, plain black

Dance Leggings, plain black

Brighton Girls Dance sweatshirt and t-shirt, black

Footwear

Trainers (no fashion trainers)

Astro-Turf shoes (optional)

Equipment - girls may bring their own equipment for sports such as hockey sticks and tennis rackets.

Safety Equipment - shin pads (also available in school shop) Gum shield (also available in school shop)

Hair

No dyed hair or shaved hairstyles.

Hair ribbons or bands, if worn, must be plain dark green, white, brown or black.

For Science and Physical Education lessons hair must always be securely tied back, if it is shoulder length or longer, and must at all times be kept off the face.

Make up

No make up in the following years - Year 7, 8, 9.

Discreet/natural only make up in Year 10 and 11.

No nail varnish or fake nails are permitted.

Jewellery

No jewellery, other than a named wristwatch, may be worn in school. One pair of small stud earrings only may be worn in school time (see below). A girl with pierced ears may wear plain studs (one only in each ear) which must be removed for PE.

Girls may wear a religious symbol on a necklace if written permission has been received by the school at the start of each academic year.

Piercings

No piercings, except ear lobes: one pair of small stud earrings only may be worn in school time. A girl with pierced ears may wear plain studs (one only in each ear) which must be removed for PE. Any additional piercings, for example nose piercings are not permissible. Parents may appeal this in exceptional circumstances and written permission should be sought in advance.

It is therefore important only to have ears pierced at the start of the summer holiday to allow time for the wound to heal so that studs etc. can be removed safely at school. If any girl is found wearing studs or rings in any other pierced areas to school, she will be asked to remove them.
